A Symbol from the Original Shrine:

CROSS OF UNITY



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She stand by her Son under the cross: Mary, the brave woman who knows that the hour has come for him to go from this world to the Father. A sword pierces her soul and at the same time she is full of confidence that this death on the cross does not have the last word. The Lord entrusts her with a new task amid her pain. At this moment, in John, the beloved disciple of Jesus, Mary accepts all his disciples as her children - including us ... for all time.

Why did the Blessed Mother settle in this small shrine in our time? So that she can also take part in my world, in my joys and my sorrows. When she is with me, I can face the challenges courageously. Her presence strengthens me so that I can courageously accept suffering. Her motherly love gives me strength and hope.

Standing under the cross can also mean: We are getting used to being "settled near Vesuvius". A word that Father once coined. Schoenstatt is located at Mont Vesuvius, that is, near world-historical shifts that bring great uncertainties with them... at Vesuvius of a gigantic shift of humanity so that we can help shape it. Even today, the shifts are so profound that, humanly speaking, it is a question of the existence and non-existence of Christian values. During the October-Week 1967, Father Kentenich spoke of "the manipulated person": "I just want to broaden our perspective and contrast all this with God's plan for us: Building and expanding a distinctly Marian kingdom of God! If we can achieve that, we will have protection across the board, come what may" (p.126).

And – that's the crucial point: The house that stands at Mount Vesuvius is our shrine. Through the attachment to the shrine, a different, a Christian value perspective slowly grows within us.

An Impulse from Life


