HOLY SPIRIT

The greatest work of the Holy Spirit, one to which all others continually refer as to a source, is the Incarnation of the Eternal Word through Mary. By his power the Virgin becomes Mother of the Saviour. It is the same spirit that fills Elisabeth during Mary's visit, when she feels the joyful movement of her child in her womb and makes Elisabeth exclaim in a loud voice: "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. Who am I that the mother of my Lord should come to me?" (Lk 1:41-43). Elisabeth is therefore the first to recognize Jesus in the power of the Holy Spirit. The Risen Lord also ultimately promises his apostles the mission of the Holy Spirit. Mary's closeness opens their frightened hearts to a new beginning in him, so that the young Church can come into being - ready to bear witness without ifs and buts. They cannot remain silent about what they have heard and seen (cf. Acts 1).

At the opening of the World Synod on October 4, Pope Francis affirmed that "the Church paused as the apostles paused on Holy Saturday". It is the Holy Spirit who "unites us in harmony across all differences. Without harmony there is no Spirit."

For Mary, the coming of the Holy Spirit was not something new. He was already the soul of her soul. And it is her gift to people today when she chooses the shrine as the place of his presence and efficacy with its gifts and fruits, as a cenacle for our time. Fr Kentenich describes it like this in the Schoenstatt Offices in the "Cenacle Hour":

There you implored the Spirit for the Church who freed her from the scourge of halfheartedness, guided her to the teaching of Christ and enkindled in her the spirit of the apostles and the martyrs. That is how you want to work in our shrine: strengthening our weak eyes of faith

so that we might see life as God sees it

and always walk by heaven's light.

An Impulse from Life

"Saint Ambrose of Milan, in his commentary on the Gospel of Luke, writes that Mary set out in haste towards the hills, 'because she rejoiced in the promise and looked to serve others with the enthusiasm born of her joy. Full of God, where else could she have gone if not towards the heights? The grace of the Holy Spirit allows no delay'. Mary's haste is thus a sign of her desire to serve, to proclaim her joy, to respond without hesitation to the grace of the Holy Spirit. (...)


