

Let an experience from the centennial celebrations motivate us:

"My moment at the Jubilee was Saturday afternoon in the pilgrims' arena, which was already impressive, with all the thousands of pilgrims from different countries and branches, and me in the middle of it all... And then SHE came. So solemn and sublime, so real, close, and true, the MTA was carried through the lines and celebrated. You could feel that there was so much reverence for this great Woman, so much personal connection with each one, and you didn't know how to pay tribute to her. Sometimes, there was applause, and then people just watched, admired, waited, and hesitated until she reached the stage and found her place. Several men carried her on a litter, and some little girls scattered roses like a queen.

When I think about it, it sounds absurd. And yet it didn't seem distant or false to me, but wholly pure and true, just like herself.

Reflection

⁶The fact that "the Church sees herself in the image of the Mother of God and protects herself" is part of our Founder's image of the Church. If the Blessed Mother is excluded from the process of salvation, it is because of a mechanistic way of thinking, even within the Church. On May 31, 1949, when Father Kentenich placed the first part of his didactic letter, the "Epistola perlonga," on the altar of the Blessed Mother, the destruction of our free society and the suppression of the Church were already on the horizon.

We long for a Church like Mary7, open to the Spirit of God. Then, as now, the Blessed Mother will be our help in times of need. Her promise is valid from the beginning: "I love those who love me." 8
