


# Day 9

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## **Impulse**

Let an experience from the centennial celebrations motivate us:

"On the night of October 17-18, I had the privilege of witnessing something awe-inspiring.

Shortly before midnight, the Girls' Youth crown made its way from House Sonnenau to the Original Shrine in a chain of girls from all over the world: from hand to hand. .... I was standing on the street above House Sonnenau and I could see all the girls who had already received the crown running toward the Original Shrine. It was a beautiful image.

Fortunately, a taxi stopped beside me and I hurried up the hill. There, young men with torches in their hands were making their way from the Motherhouse of the Schoenstatt Sisters of Mary to the Adoration Church. It was an eloquent image. I was very impressed by these moments: on the threshold of the new century of Schoenstatt, the girls on the valley flocked to the Original Shrine and remained in the place where everything began 100 years ago. At the same time, the boys on the mountain went to

Father Kentenich and stayed with the person with whom everything started 100 years ago. In my heart, I thought: "Schoenstatt can go into the future with joy and certainty.

#### Reflection

At the beginning of Schoenstatt's history were the promising words of Father Kentenich in the Founding Document: "I would like to make this place a place of pilgrimage, a place of grace for our house and for the whole German province, and perhaps even further afield.". This has become a reality. Today, we are the new "sodalists" urged by the mission to establish Schoenstatt in the world. We have received a holy inheritance: the same treasure as then. It has been given to us, and we are urged to give it to our Church and today's world.
